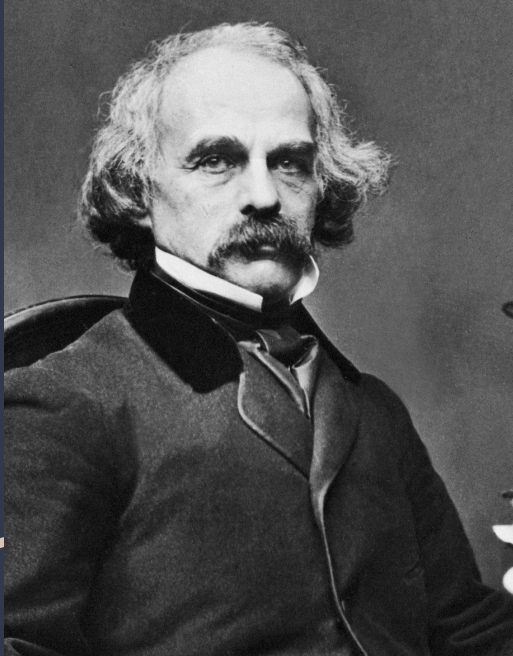

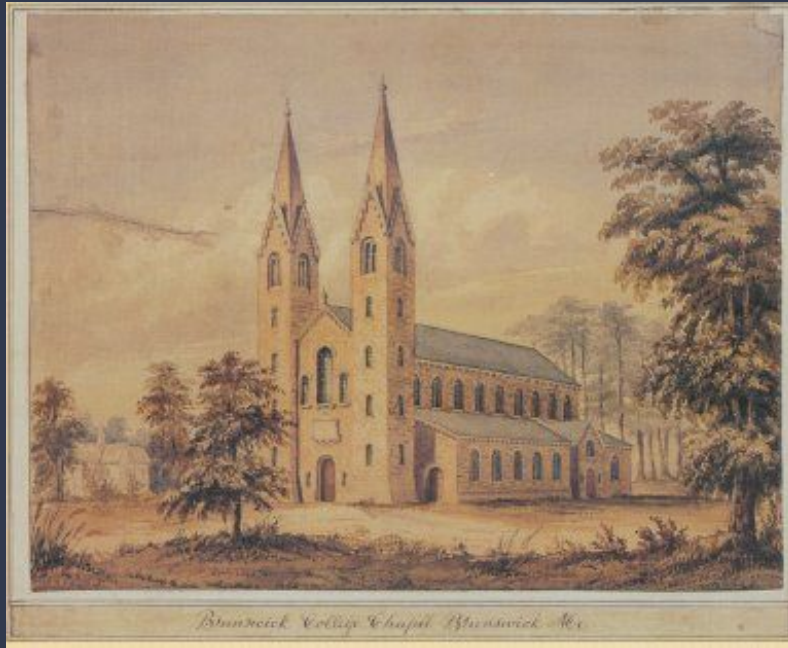

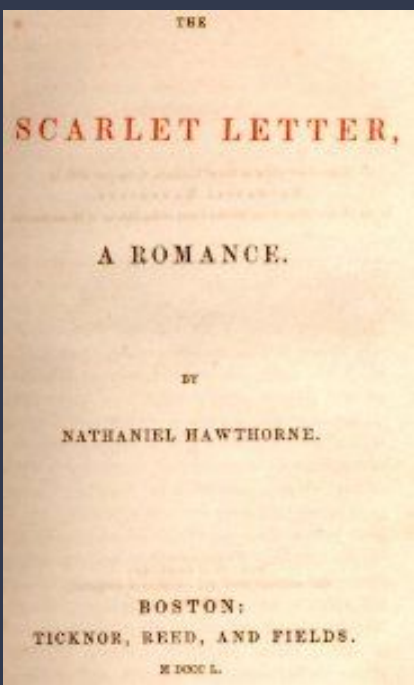
Who was Nathaniel Hawthorne?



- Born July 4, 1804 in Salem Massachusetts
- One of the Greatest fiction writers in American Literature.
- American Novelist and short story writer who was a master of the allegorical and symbolic tale.
- He added the W to his name Hawthorne



- Hawthorne had a leg injury that lead him to developing an appetite for reading.
- Hawthorne went to Bowdoin College in Maine (1821-1824)
- He married Sophia Peabody
- He was a man with moral insight because he inherited the Puritan tradition of moral earnest.
